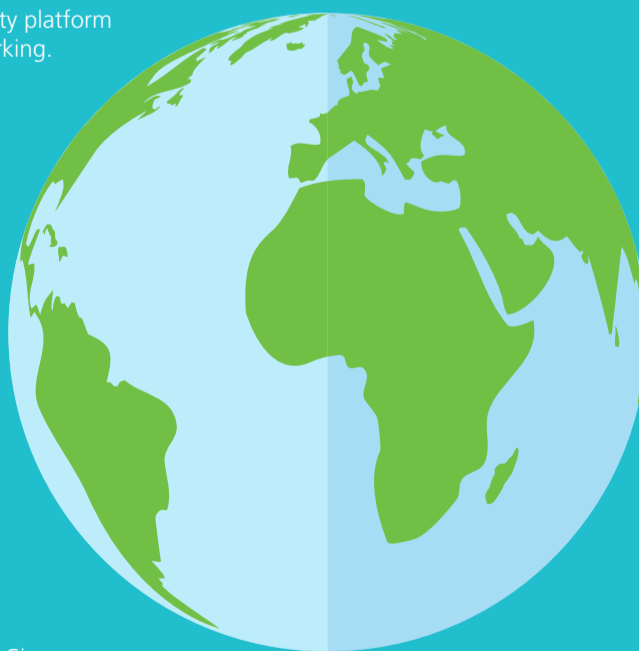
Energy-efficient server room design cooled by ground-source heat pump.
